# Cardiac troponins and high-sensitivity cardiac troponin assays

Thursday, February, 13, 2014



Petr Jarolim, MD, PhD is the Medical Director of Clinical Chemistry and Laboratory Control at Brigham and Women's Hospital (BWH) and Dana Farber Cancer Institute (DFCI) and of the BWH Ambulatory Care Center Clinical Laboratories. He also directs the Biomarker Research /TIMI Clinical Trials Laboratory in the Department of Pathology at BWH. He is Associate Professor of Pathology at Harvard Medical School and Principal Investigator in multiple trials of both established and novel cardiovascular biomarkers for diagnosis and prediction of adverse events in coronary artery disease and heart failure. The main focus of his research is the utilization of the highly sensitive and ultrasensitive cardiac troponin assays. Dr. Jarolim has worked on the Expert Review Panel of the American Society of Clinical Pathology and on committees of the Academy of Clinical Laboratory Physicians and Scientists. He is the member of the Scientific Advisory Board of MedicalAutomation.org.

#### **Directions to the Hilton Garden Inn in Waltham:**

From Route 93 (Boston or New Hampshire): Take 93 South to I-95/128 South, Follow to Route 128/95 South to Exit 27A - Totten Pond Road. At the end of the exit ramp turn right onto Totten Pond Road. Proceed one quarter of a mile to the entrance of the second office park on your right. Turn right and proceed up the driveway, and bear left to the hotel entrance.

From I-90 (Massachusetts Turnpike): Take I-90 to Route 128/95 North. On Rte. 128 North take Exit 27A. At the end of the exit ramp turn right onto Totten Pond Road. Proceed one quarter of a mile to the entrance of the second office park on your right. Turn right and proceed up the driveway, and bear left to the hotel entrance.
