Gary L. Horowitz M.D Mining Patient Data to Improve Laboratory Quality

Gary L. Horowitz, M.D. is the Medical Director of the Clinical Chemistry Laboratory at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center (BIDMC) and is a highly respected member of the Clinical Chemistry community in the Greater Boston area. Dr Horowitz graduated with a M.D. degree from Harvard Medical School in 1976. After completing a research fellowship in nephrology at Tufts Medical Center, he moved to Beth Israel Hospital in 1979 to pursue a residency in clinical pathology. On completion of specialist training in 1981, Dr Horowitz joined Beth Israel on a permanent basis as Medical Director of the Clinical Chemistry Laboratory. Dr Horowitz is an Associate Professor in Pathology at Harvard Medical School, where he has an extensive role in guiding the training of pathology residents in chemical pathology. Dr Horowitz is a board certified Clinical Pathologist with the American Board of Pathology. He has

served on the Chemistry Resource Committee of the College of American Pathologists (CAP) at various periods over the past 10-15 years, being appointed as Chair in 2007 through 2010 and again in 2012. Dr Horowitz is a strong advocate for the development of quality indicators in laboratory medicine, as evidenced by his role within the CAP Working Group on Accuracy-Based Surveys. He has also worked closely with The Clinical Laboratory Standards Institute (CLSI), serving as both Chair and Vice-Chair on guideline development groups of notable publications including Document C28 on reference intervals and Document GP27 on using proficiency testing to improve the clinical laboratory. Dr Horowitz is also active in research in clinical chemistry as evidenced by his outstanding publication record in the areas of laboratory automation, informatics, cardiac biomarkers, therapeutic drug monitoring and toxicology.
