David D. Koch, Ph.D., DABCC, FACB President, AACC Hb A1c testing:

Analytical choices, reporting units, and clinical ramifications

David D. Koch, Ph.D., DABCC, FACB, is Professor of Pathology in the Department of Pathology & Laboratory Medicine, Emory University, Atlanta, GA, and Director of Clinical Chemistry, Toxicology, and Point-of-Care Testing at Grady Memorial Hospital in Atlanta. He is certified as a Diplomate of the American Board of Clinical Chemistry and is a Fellow of the National Academy of Clinical Biochemistry. He is Co-Director of the ComACC-accredited Postdoctoral Training Program in Clinical Chemistry at Emory. Dr. Koch's current scientific, clinical, and educational efforts reflect his role as a generalist clinical chemist. He particularly specializes in proper decision-making about deploying new instruments and methods. His expertise on a number of topics, including the evaluation of methods, is sought after by significant organizations regionally, nationally, and internationally. He is President of the American Association for Clinical

Chemistry (AACC) in 2015, and has served on the Board of Directors of AACC in 4 of the last 5 years. Before being recruited by Emory, Dr. Koch directed the Clinical Pathology Laboratories for the Department of Safety Assessment, Merck Research Laboratories, West Point, PA, from 2001-05. Prior to 2001, Dr. Koch was an Associate Professor in the Department of Pathology & Laboratory Medicine, University of Wisconsin, Madison, WI, and Director, Clinical Chemistry Service, Core Laboratory and Emerging Technologies, Clinical Laboratories, University of Wisconsin Hospital & Clinics, Madison, WI.

Dr. Koch earned a BS in Chemistry and a Ph.D. in Analytical Chemistry from Purdue University in West Lafayette, IN. He fulfilled fellowship training in clinical chemistry at Washington University in St. Louis, MO.
