Description: Roughly 70% of all medical decisions are made on the basis of a clinical laboratory test, yet very few physicians and essentially nobody in the general public understands the work needed to generate a quality laboratory result. There are dire consequences if a mistake is made in the lab. Nobody will promote the value of our services except us. If we fail, it is likely that reduced reimbursement for lab tests will be in our future. In this presentation, we will discuss these concepts and present a methodology as to how we can promote our profession.

- Comprehend how failures in quality management of laboratory tests can have catastrophic medical consequences.
