# **Accommodation Information**

Meeting attendees are responsible for booking their own accommodation. The organizing committee recommends the following convenient options:

#### 1. Hotel Alma (www.hotelalma.ca)

This hotel is right on the University of Calgary campus and is  $\sim$ 10-15 minute walking distance from the meeting site. Cost is  $\sim$ 160 USD/night.

### 2. Motel Village

This area is 2 train stops away from the meeting site (~10 mins). It has many different hotels with varied pricing. Two recommendations are ALOFT Calgary University (<a href="http://www.aloftcalgaryuniversity.com/">http://www.aloftcalgaryuniversity.com/</a>; ~150 USD/night) and Hampton Inn and Suites, Calgary University (<a href="http://www.hamptoncalgary.com/">http://www.hamptoncalgary.com/</a>; ~130 USD/night). Other hotels in this area include Comfort Inn & Suites University, Holiday Inn Express & Suites NW Calgary, Best Western Village Park Inn, and EconoLodge Inn & Suites University.
