

Gary L. Horowitz, MD

Dr. Horowitz received his bachelor's degree in chemistry from Harvard College in 1972 and his medical degree from Harvard Medical School in 1976. He completed a clinical pathology residency at Beth Israel Hospital in Boston in 1981, after which he became the Director of Clinical Chemistry at that institution. When it merged with New England Deaconess Hospital in 1996, he became the Director of Clinical Chemistry for the merged institution, Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, a position he still holds. He is also an Associate Professor of Pathology at Harvard Medical School.

He served on the Chemistry Resource Committee of the College of American Pathologists from 2002 through 2010; he was Chair of that committee from 2007 through 2010. He was re-appointed Chair of that committee in 2012. He has been an active member of the CAP working group on Accuracy-Based Surveys since its inception a few years ago.

Dr. Horowitz has also worked with the Clinical Laboratory Standards Institute (CLSI): he was Chair of the working group on Document C28 (Reference Intervals) and is now Vice-Chair of the working group on Document GP27 (Using Proficiency Testing to Improve the Clinical Laboratory).

His professional interests include cardiac markers, therapeutic drug monitoring, toxicology, automation, and informatics.
